


## Key Messages: identifying scarcity

- 3. If we do not address this scarcity, we are flying blind



## Scarcity in context





#### Global challenges raise the stakes for gender equality

The earthquake in Turkey and Syria, the war in Ukraine, climate change, Covid-19, and energy crises all hold implications for gender equality.



Halfway to 2030, there is still a pervasive lack of gender data Only 48% of data needed to monitor SDG5 is currently available.



## Financial uncertainty strains the resource envelope


Crises bring competing priorities for national governments and aid donors, with tightened public spending.



## 1. Financing for gender data fell precipitously in 2020



#### Funding for gender data: disbursements in constant USD (2020 prices)



In 2020, financing for gender statistics declined to its lowest point since the launch of the SDGs.



# 2. Trends in gender data financing run counter to financing for gender equality



ODA for gender equality vs. funding for gender data: % change in financing (base year 2011)



Financing for gender equality is growing, while support for gender data stagnated and subsequently declined.

#### ...for effective program targeting.


In scarce financial times, gender data is more critical than ever to channel investments in gender equality where they are most needed.

#### ...for transparency and accountability.

Gender data is key to enable transparency and accountability in financing for gender equality and learn what works.

### ...for monitoring progress.

Gender data is critical for tracking development progress, including progress towards the SDGs. Indicators for SDG5 are among the lowest in global coverage.
